



color and light looks good!




# DESTRUCTIVE EDITING:

# PHOTOSH TUTORIAL CUTOUT

If you plan to cut out an image, it's best to shoot the photo on a solid color that is not part of the subject. Think about if you're going to place the cutout on a light or dark background and shoot accordingly to make the cutout process easier.

QUALITY Excellent use of color/contrast/light.
No distracting background elements. Not blurry, has proper focus.
